Scarecrow Competition Rules

Registration: Please complete the Show Entry form in full, this is available on the show website or in the LTP Schedule. When you are registered your team will be given a registration number. **Registrations close Friday 16th February 2023.**

Eligibility: The Scarecrow Contest is for school, family and community groups, it is not open to individuals. In the interests of fairness, adult involvement should be kept to a minimum.

Materials: Scarecrows may be subjected to rain and wind, and should be durable with everything securely attached. You can use any materials to make your scarecrow, but electricity, glass and open flames are not to be used. A stake will be secured in the ground to which your scarecrow should be attached. Your scarecrow may be free standing, however it should be attached to the stake for security

Size Limitation: Scarecrow displays may be between 1.5 and 2 metres.

Restrictions: Scarecrows must be in good taste and family friendly. The Show Committee could restrict your entry if it is not deemed family friendly. We may use photographs of scarecrows and their entrants for publicity and promotions.

Signage: The Scarecrow must be displayed with the scarecrow entry number. This number may include a sponsorship logo.

Judging: Scarecrows will be judged by an independent Judging Panel. The guidelines for judging are as follows:

Eco-Friendly the scarecrow demonstrates the principle of No.8 Wire.

Creativity

creative and unusual idea for a scarecrow.

In addition, all scarecrows are eligible for the People's Choice Award – voting will be open to the general public via a ballot box in the Edna Wills Hall. One vote per person.

Delivery and Set-up of Entries: Scarecrows will be on display and available for judging) throughout the 2023 A&P Show period. Scarecrows must be delivered to the Show grounds Burnside entrance by 5pm Friday the 23rd February. Late entries will not be accepted.

Scarecrow Disposal: At the conclusion of the A&P Show, teams are responsible for removing their scarecrow from the show grounds and making arrangements for its disposal (or otherwise).

Fred & Eunice Rodie

CHARITABLE TRUST

The Fred and Eunice Rodie Charitable Trust was set up in 1988 by the late Eunice Rodie to recognize and perpetuate the shared interest of herself and Fred in the South Taranaki Community. Fred and Eunice Rodie were both from local families and lived and worked in the South Taranaki Community. In absence of family of their own, Fred and Eunice generously donated substantial assets within their charitable trust for the benefit of the wider community. Fred's father was Station Master of the Hawera Railway Station and his brother Town Clerk at Manaia. Eunice Nicholas grew up in Caledonia Street, Her father John was a beekeeper.

Fred and Eunice lived in Kaponga where Fred was Branch Manager of Newton King Ltd. In 1948 they moved to Hawera as Fred became Manager of the Hawera branch. Eunice did secretarial work for Walkley and Laurance Accountants in Hawera. They bought a farm on the Skeet Road and one on the Auroa Road. Throughout their lives they both took a great interest in the farming operations. Fred being a meticulous manager and record keeper in his work and farming operations.

They were kindly, friendly, private people who enjoyed being involved. Fred was very involved with Rotary and contributed generously to many worthy causes in our local community for example; to the Rotary organised Intensive Care and Scanner Trusts, and a Hall of Residence at Massey University. Eunice was very involved in the St Mary's Church and for a number of years was Fellowship Secretary.

Fred retired from Newton King when he was 60 in 1970. He and Eunice continued to live in their 57 Disraeli Street home (next to Bayly Park) until Fred died in 1974. Eunice soon after moved into a unit in Argyle Street until her health required admission to Calvery/Trinity rest home/hospital.

Fred Rodie Born 1910 died 1974, Eunice Luxford Rodie Born 1910 died 2000.

- 4. Where points are given, points to count as follows; 1st 3 points, 2nd 2 points, 3rd 1 point, Premier bloom 3 points, Special prize 1 point.
- 5. In the event of a tie for 'Points Prize' most 1st prizes to count.
- 6. Committee reserves the right to substitute product prizes of similar value for cash.
- 7. All entries judged at discretion of the judge.
- 8. Trophies and prizes will be awarded at 3pm on Sunday in the Edna Wills Hall.
- 9. The engraving is the responsibility of the person receiving the cup.

Rose Section Rules

- 1. Decorative Blooms Should be between one quarter and half open with gracefully arranged, well formed petals producing a bloom of more slender proportions than Exhibition Blooms, judged in the order of form, freshness, balance, and foliage.
- Exhibition Blooms Should be between half and three quarters open, of good size, with ample petals symmetrically arranged within a circular outline around a well-formed centre, judged in the order of form, freshness, balance, and foliage.
- 3. Stem of Roses Should have well spaced, gracefully arranged flowers with side buds. Judged in the order of form, freshness, balance, and foliage. The type of flower is not taken into consideration.
- 4. Display All roses to be displayed in vases provided.
- 5. Exhibits are required to be named name tags will be supplied.
- 6. Exhibitors should make sure that the stem has flowers open. Buds on stem not open do not constitute flowers to be classified as flowers. The sepal must be down, and one petal unfurled.
- 7. Where a bloom is required this is a single flower with no side buds if it has side buds then it becomes a stem. Side buds in bloom classes should be carefully removed leaving only the bloom.
